SAM SMITH TO PERFORM AT LACMA's 2015 ART+FILM GALA

Fifth Annual Gala on Saturday, November 7, 2015 Honors James Turrell and Alejandro G. Iñárritu

Co-Chaired by Leonardo DiCaprio and Eva Chow and Presented by Gucci



(Los Angeles, September 10, 2015) The Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) is pleased to announce that GRAMMY Award-winning artist Sam Smith will perform at the 2015 Art+Film Gala honoring artist James Turrell and filmmaker Alejandro G. Iñárritu. Co-chaired by LACMA trustee Eva Chow and actor Leonardo DiCaprio, this memorable evening will take place on Saturday, November 7, 2015. Gucci provides generous support to LACMA for the fifth consecutive year as the presenting sponsor of the annual event.

"Sam Smith is one of the most incredible artists today," said Eva Chow. "His voice is beautiful and his songs are powerful; he is sure to be a major highlight of this year's gala. We are thrilled to have him."

About Sam Smith

British sensation Sam Smith emerged in early 2014 and quickly garnered attention with two esteemed awards: the BRITs Critic's Choice Award as well as BBC Sound of 2014 prize. The 23-year old has since gone on to make US pop music history with his debut album, *In The Lonely Hour*, selling more copies in its first week of release than any other UK male artist in the history of SoundScan. The critically-lauded full-length bowed at No. 2 on the *Billboard* 200 in the US, while it entered the UK Albums Chart at No. 1.

Smith's award-winning streak has shown no signs of slowing down since those early days, and most recently he took home four GRAMMY Awards (from six nominations) including Best New Artist, Record of the Year, Song of the Year, and Best Pop Vocal Album. Additionally, Smith won Favorite Male Artist–Pop/Rock honors at the 2014 American Music Awards, the VH1 2014 You Oughta Know Artist Of The Year Award, Best New Act at the Q Awards, as well as a BET Award for Best New Artist.

On the one-year anniversary of its US release, *In The Lonely Hour* was still charting in the Top 20 of the *Billboard* 200 and has been certified 2x Platinum by the RIAA. This, along with additional single certifications for "Stay With Me," "Lay Me Down," "Leave Your Lover," and "Money On My Mind," further underscores the tremendous success the young UK artist has had in the US.

In its first year of release in the UK, *In The Lonely Hour* logged an astonishing 50 weeks in the Top 5, a chart feat only previously achieved by The Beatles, according to OfficialCharts.com. The last, and only other, debut album in Official Charts history with this kind of unshakeable performance in its first year of release was The Beatles' *Please Please Me* in 1963. Smith was the only artist to sell one million albums in both the US and the UK in 2014.

Art+Film Gala

Art+Film Gala proceeds will be used to support LACMA's initiative to make film more central to the museum's curatorial programming, while also funding LACMA's broader mission. This includes exhibitions, acquisitions, and educational programming, in addition to screenings that explore the intersection of art and film. In recent years, LACMA has dynamically increased its curatorial programming to include film related exhibitions such as *Tim Burton*, *Dalí: Painting & Film*, *Masterworks of Expressionist Cinema: Caligari and Metropolis*, *Stanley Kubrick*, *Hans Richter: Encounters*, *Under the Mexican Sky: Gabriel Figueroa—Art and Film*, *David Hockney: Seven Yorkshire Landscape Videos*, 2011, *Agnès Varda in Californialand*, *David Hockney: The Jugglers*, Haunted Screens: German Cinema in the 1920s, Christian Marclay's The Clock, and the forthcoming exhibition Diana Thater: The Sympathetic Imagination. The museum has also witnessed a growth of new audiences as a result of the robust film programming led by Elvis Mitchell through the Film Independent at LACMA partnership.

The Gala Host Committee is chaired by Gucci Creative Director Alessandro Michele, while the honorary committee members are outstanding patrons, visionaries, and leaders from the worlds of film, art, music, and fashion. The evening included a spectacular musical performance by Culture Club as well as a special menu prepared by the renowned chef, Joachim Splichal of Patina. Last year's Art+Film Gala raised over \$3.85 million, with proceeds supporting LACMA's film initiatives and future exhibitions, acquisitions, and programming.
