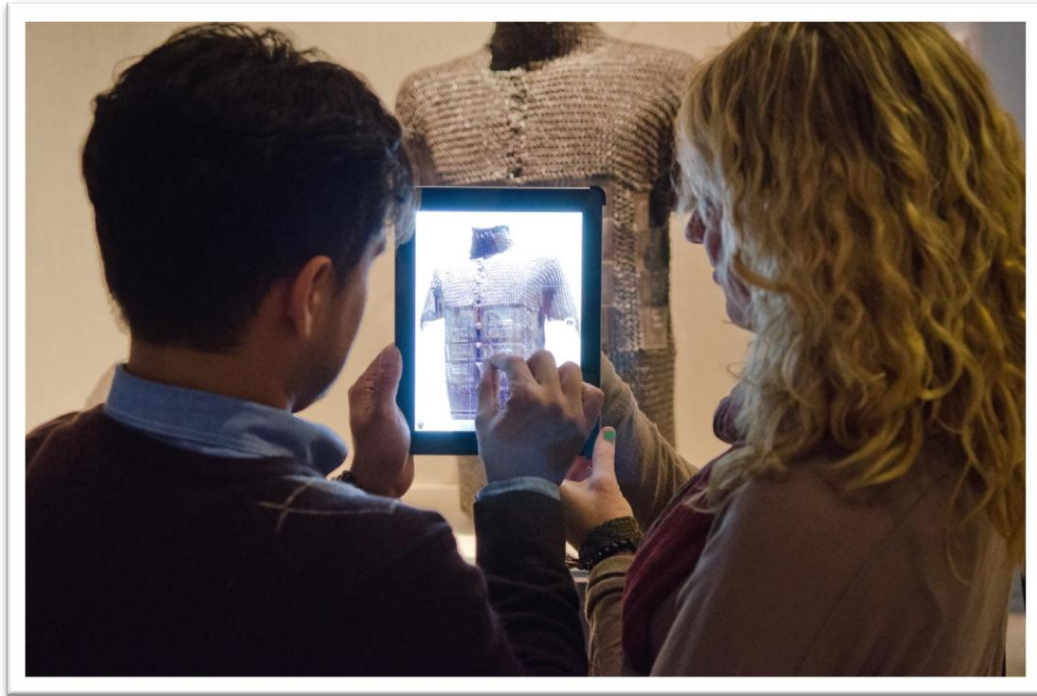

WHO SHOULD APPLY?

K–12 teachers from all Los Angeles County school districts are invited to apply. Teachers are encouraged to attend in teams of five. Enrollment is limited to 40 participants.

WHAT WILL TEACHERS ACCOMPLISH DURING THE INSTITUTE?

The *Art + Film Institute* emphasizes interdisciplinary teaching approaches using works of art and technology. Through independent and guided exploration of LACMA's encyclopedic collection and the special exhibition *Haunted Screens: German Expressionist Cinema of the 1920s*, participants will:

- Have behind-the-scenes experiences with museum staff and visiting artists through gallery discussions and hands-on activities
- Learn inquiry-based techniques for teaching with works of art
- Focus on the development of visual and media literacy skills
- Make interdisciplinary connections between art, media, and core subjects
- Work in teams to produce a film

Program activities and materials address California Visual and Performing Arts Standards and California Common Core Standards for English/Language Arts.

WHAT IS PROVIDED FOR PARTICIPANTS?

- Free Continental Breakfast every morning at 8:30 am
- Free iPad Mini with iMovie software (one per school)
- One LAUSD Salary Point Credit or up to seven USC Continuing Education Units
- Free one-year LACMA membership
- Free season pass to *Evenings for Educators* professional development programs for K–12 educators
- Free buses for students and their parents to attend family programs at LACMA (schools first-come, first-served)

WHAT IS EXPECTED OF PARTICIPANTS?

- Participation in all three days of the Institute
- Arrival at the museum by 9 am and departure after 4 pm every day
- Collaboration and contribution of ideas throughout the program
- Screening of short film for colleagues on the final day of the Institute
- Participation in program evaluation
