

ABOUT LACMA

Founded in 1910 as part of the Museum of Science, History, and Art, LACMA established itself as an independent institution in 1961, and opened its new facilities on its current campus in 1965. Under the visionary leadership of Michael Govan, LACMA mounts more than 30 exhibitions and installations a year, welcomes over 1.2 million visitors annually, and has increased its exhibition space by 100,000 square feet. The permanent collection has grown to 130,000+ objects that rank among the best in the world.

BING THEATER

Home to LACMA's renowned film and music programs, the Bing Theater is equipped for 35mm and 70mm film as well as video productions. The theater also features stadium seating.

Facility fees include museum admission; security, including gallery attendants; custodial services; full-service events coordination; in-house audiovisual staffing and basic equipment; and standard electrical and lighting support. Additional fees may apply for specially ticketed exhibitions.

EDUCATION

LACMA hosts more than a dozen free or low-cost education programs, both on campus and off-site, including art classes, lectures, and gallery tours, for 500,000+ children, teachers, and parents each year.



MUSIC

LACMA's four complimentary programs, ranging from jazz to Latin music, present 100+ concerts and have a combined audience of more than 95,000. LACMA is a seven-time national winner of the ASCAP/Chamber Music America Award for adventurous programming.



ART+FILM GALA

Now in its sixth year, LACMA's Art+Film Gala is the marquee cultural event in Los Angeles. The Gala brings together over 600 luminaries from the worlds of art, film, music, fashion, and philanthropy to support the museum's dedication to film as a central element of its curatorial programming.

EXHIBITIONS

Each year LACMA mounts more than a dozen ambitious special exhibitions and over 30 exhibitions and installations featuring the permanent collection.



FILM

The yearly Film Independent at LACMA and Tuesday matinee programs showcase contemporary and classic films, documentaries, television screenings, and live performances for 40,000 guests.



COLLECTORS COMMITTEE

Since inception in 1986, Collectors Committee has raised more than \$38 million toward 210 art acquisitions. The weekend celebration includes intimate dinners hosted by LACMA donors in their homes, and a gala with a live auction and four-course dinner.
