**WHO & WHAT:** The Los Angeles County Museum of Art (LACMA) hosts the ultimate late-night party with its annual Muse 'til Midnight. The evening begins at Chris Burden's *Urban Light* sculpture, where design collective **ISO50** brings the dance party with DJ sets by **Tycho** and special guest opener **Christopher Willits**. The performance is followed by the sounds of **The Silver Lake Chorus**, a local indie-rock choir performing live inside three of LACMA's exhibitions, *Expressionism in Germany and France: From Van Gogh to Kandinsky*, *John Altoon*, and *Marsden Hartley: The German Paintings 1913–1915* (not yet open to the public).

Since its inception in 1965, LACMA has been devoted to collecting works of art that span both history and geography, in addition to representing Los Angeles's uniquely diverse population. Today LACMA is the largest art museum in the western United States, with a collection that boasts over 120,000 objects dating from antiquity to the present, encompassing the geographic world and nearly the entire history of art. Among the museum's strengths are its holdings of art representing Asia, Latin America (from pre-Columbian to the present), and the Islamic world. LACMA is the only museum in the United States that both collects and regularly exhibits Iranian art from the fourth-millennium B.C. to the present. A museum of international stature as well as a vital part of Southern California, LACMA shares its vast collections through exhibitions, public programs, and research facilities that attract over a million visitors annually.
