

5 QUESTIONS, 5 ARTISTS: REFRAMING PORTRAITURE

FILM SCREENING: WITH DRAWN ARMS

Location: Ted Mann Theater

Introduction by Lyndon Barrois. Post-screening panel with: codirectors Glenn Kaino and Afshin Shahidi, Tommie Smith, executive producer Jesse Williams, co-moderated by Jacqueline Stewart and Rhea Combs.

Champion sprinter Tommie Smith raised his gloved fist as a gesture of Black unity after winning the gold medal in the 200m sprint event at the 1968 Olympics awards ceremony in Mexico, creating an iconic image of the 20th century while turning his life upside down. Smith speaks movingly about what led to his gesture—and the struggles he has faced since—in this documentary that also spotlights his multiyear collaboration with Los Angeles-based conceptual artist Glenn Kaino, one of the film's directors.



Artist Georgia O'Keeffe loved nature and the desert landscape. She was fascinated by the bones and skulls that she found on her walks. She thought they were beautiful! This painting is called *Horse's Skull with Pink Rose*.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK!

Focus on the horse's skull and the flower. What details do you notice?

Artists often combine objects in interesting ways. Take a vote with your friends or family. Is a rose a perfect fit to go with a horse's skull? Why or why not? Does everyone agree?

Now focus on the colors in the painting. The artist didn't use a lot of colors.

How many colors do you see?

FUN FACTS:

Georgia O'Keeffe knew, even when she was a little girl, that she wanted to become a painter.

Often the flowers in her skull paintings were artificial.

Sometimes skulls can represent death, but Georgia O'Keeffe saw a lot of life and eternal beauty in them.

YOUR TITLE HERE

Activity: In the space above, create your own artwork inspired by Georgia O'Keeffe's painting.

Step 1: Scavenger hunt! Look for several objects that might be interesting together. They can be things you find on a walk or things you already have at home.

Step 2: Arrange the objects together until you find two that make a great fit. This might take a few tries.

Step 3: Gather your art-making materials. Colored pencils or crayons or even watercolors will all work great. If you aren't using the space here, you'll also need blank paper.

Step 4: Pick just four colors to work with: two dark and two light. In *Horse's Skull with Pink Rose* there are only a few colors, but they are vibrant together.

Step 5: Draw or paint your objects. Start by drawing their outline or shape, then color them in.

Step 6: Take a look at Georgia O'Keeffe's painting again. Notice how the white skull pops with the blue background. What color will you use for your background to make your objects pop?

Step 7: Are you done? If so, sign your artwork and give it a title!
