

AAKE MY PICTURE!




A picture of a person is called a portrait. A picture of yourself is called a self-portrait. Creating portraits is a great way to make memories and to record history. The exhibition *Afro-Atlantic Histories* has many portraits on view, from places like Latin America, the Caribbean, and the United States and Africa.

This painting, called *Musicians* by Heitor dos Prazeres, is a portrait that shows a joyous scene of two people dancing and making music. Maybe you thought a portrait was a picture of a face, but a portrait can be almost anything! How would you make a self-portrait? How would

you make a portrait of a friend, family member, or character in a book?

What are you going to draw? A face, a whole body, a body part, an activity, an object? You are the artist, so you get to choose. What does your portrait look like?

Start with your big ideas. Maybe you want to draw yourself as you look today. Maybe you want to remember the time you jumped so high on that trampoline. Or maybe you want to make a picture of your grandmother sitting on the couch with her dog. Think about what you want to draw!

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
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
